- *The US Navy SEALS are created.
- *Telstar first live trans-Atlantic television signal.
- *First Beatles single "Love Me Do" released.
- *Goldfish Crackers & Chips Ahoy! were invented.
- *Glenn Bell's first Taco Bell opened in Downey, California.
- *The first computer video game, Spacewar, was invented.
- *Audio cassettes were invented.
- *Jackie Robinson became the first African-American to be elected to the Baseball Hallof Fame.

Over the past 61 years a lot has also happened in our community. The early days consisted of the planning and developing of the Pines. The WPPCA was formed in 1962 and folks stepped up to form our association. Over the years hundreds of residents have served as officers, committee members or just helped out. Orange County Sustainability Grant Application

A team of WPP volunteers are working to help submit an Orange County Neighborhood Grant which will be used to update the landscape lighting in the mall entrance. We are taking the first steps to improve the Mall lighting through the Orange County Sustainable Communities Grant.

The intent of the Sustainable Communities Grant program is to provide funding for neighborhood organizations to implement small projects to reduce pollution and their carbon footprint. The eligible project we are addressing is lighting, electricity generation, and pollution reduction by replacing our existing lighting with more energy efficient LED landscape lighting.

The process is rather tedious with specific requirements such as at least three Orange County vendor bids who are licensed and insured to work in the county. The committee has completed the grant application and once bids are received, the committee will submit the application along with the bids to the county for approval.

We also hope to update the four small entrance sign lights as well. Thanks to committee members: Joseph McCluan, Denise Ertler, Ashley Roof, Vanessa Philman and Mayba Torres.



A Little History of Winter Park High School

Winter Park High School is one of nineteen public high schools in Orange County. Winter Park High School is a International Baccalaureate school and delivers Advanced Placement courses. The school was actually constructed at 528 Huntington Avenue in 1923 and was one of the first high schools in Orange County. The school remained in this location until construction began in 1969 at the present location (2100 Summerfield Road). The original campus remains in use to this day as the Winter Park High School Ninth Grade Center, a campus exclusively used by ninth-grade students.

Meeting called to order by WPPCA President, Peter Mason at 7:32 pm. A quorum was present. The president welcomed everyone and thanked them for taking the time out of their busy schedules to attend the Board of Directors Monthly Meeting.

Officer Reports: President: Peter Mason thanked everyone for all the volunteer work everyone does on behalf of the organization. Peter appointed Michelle Deleon as chair of the Events Committee and Melissa Johnson as chair of the Membership Committee. We have one new committee member, Carol Magierski, who will be on the Code Enforcement and Mall Maintenance Committees. We still need more members on the Events, Membership and New Neighbor Welcome Committees. Peter has sent thank you letters to 38 Gold Members and 3 Platinum Members. 
