- * The US Navy SEALS are created.

- * Goldfish Crackers & Chips Ahoy! were invented.
- * The first computer video game, Spacewar, was invented.
- * Audio cassettes were invented.
- * Samuel L. Gravely becomes the first Black commander of a U.S. Navy ship, the USS Falgout.

Over the past 62 years a lot has also happened in our community. The early days consisted of the planning and developing the Pines. When the WPPCA was created in 1962 residents stepped up to form our association to ensure we were a planned community to thrive for many decades to come. I want to personally thank those hundreds of residents who have served as Officers, Directors, Committee Members or just helped to keep our organization strong and the Pines a preferred place to live in Central Florida. We continue to rely on residents to keep our community alive and engaged by giving of their time and talent. Just think, our voluntary association membership only cost \$6.00 in 1962 and sixty-two years later it only cost \$50.00; although we have many residents that contribute at much higher levels. It is the dedicated commitment of these residents who pay their membership each year that keeps your WPPCA going.

I look forward to continuing to serve the Pines and look forward to your contribution of time, talent and financial contributions. This being an election year we also have residents that have stepped up to volunteer to work the election polls and donate their earnings back to the WPPCA. We will have a recap of those folks in the next Needles. We have grown since 1962 and a lot has changed but what hasn't changed over the past 62 years is the dedication of so many Pines residents and I am humbled by all the time our volunteers put in.

Thank you to all who have made the Pines a wonderful place to live.



WPPCA Board Of Directors Monthly Meeting Minutes

February 15, 2024 @ 7:30 PM, via Zoom

Directors in attendance: Peter Mason (President), Colby Roof (Treasurer), Michelle Deleon, Fran Frataccia, Melissa Johnson, Shanon Larimer; Directors absent: Joe McCluan (1st VP), Denise Ertler (2nd VP), Jim Kiger; WPPCA Committee Members in attendance: Carol Magierski; WPPCA Members in attendance: None; WPPCA Non-Members in attendance: None; Guests in attendance: None.

Officer Reports: President: Peter Mason thanked everyone for volunteering. Becky Clish stepped off the Events Committee, Melissa Johnson stepped off Mall Maintenance, and Tonio Bianca joined the New Neighbor Welcome Committee. We need more members for Events, Membership, Code Enforcement & New Neighbor Welcome Committees. We have 52 Gold and 8 Platinum Members. WPPCA poll workers for the 3/19/24 election have been cut to 6 due to Orange County cutbacks. There was a fun Social Gathering for Directors and Committee Members on 2/1/24. Peter reviewed the WPPCA Document Retention Policy. Motion: Colby Roof moved to adopt the WPPCA Document Retention and Destruction Policy, Draft #5, dated January 17, 2024, as presented in the pre-reads. Shanon Larimer seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously with no abstentions. Annual reviews of all JDs & SOPs are done except for one outstanding. Peter had seven residents contact him, which he responded to.

Secretary: Peter Mason said he is the Acting Secretary until we find someone. The motion to approve the WPPCA BOD Meeting Minutes of 1/10/24, was previously unanimously approved.

Treasurer: Colby Roof reported on the January 2024 P&L: Month Total Income @ \$10,054, Total Expenses @ \$1,174, and NOI @ \$8,880. YTD Total Income @ \$22,897, Total Expenses @ \$3,234, and NOI @ \$19,663. The total bank balance was \$26,449. Motion: Fran Frataccia moved to accept the Treasurer's report as presented. Michelle Deleon seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously with no abstentions.

1st Vice President: Peter Mason reported on behalf of Joe McCluan. The next grant may be to install informational signs at the main Mall entrance and Cady Way Trail and/or to trim the palms at the Mall entrance with prioritization given to the palm tree trimming.

2nd Vice President: Peter Mason said Denise Ertler had no report.

Committee Reports: Code Enforcement: Fran Frataccia reported the following 7 incidents including boat & car in the front yard, campers in driveway, high grass, assault/physical fight, theft/stolen vehicle, car with expired tag.

Digital: Peter Mason reported on behalf of Jim Kiger. Website: Jim has been doing updates. Facebook: Joe McCluan has volunteered to help. We are still trying to get an ex-resident's task access removed from our official WPPCA Facebook account. Instagram: Need a volunteer. We are still trying to get an ex-resident to change the name of their Instagram account as it says Winter Park Pines which confuses residents. Nextdoor: Needles sponsors have been posted. BOD Meeting date was posted.

Events: Michelle Deleon reported: Yoga: 4 folks for February, cancelling March. Classes planned for April – June.

WPP Garage Sale: The official one is on March 23rd from 9 am-1 pm. Residents are confused as there is an outside group competing with our event. Need volunteers to help with tasks. WPP Happy Hour Meet-Up: On April 18th at the Bonfire Grill at Winter Pines Golf Club from 6 pm to 8 pm. Community Garage Sale Confusion: The official WPPCA Spring Garage Sale is on 3/23/24 not March 2nd as advertised by an outside company. Peter & Michelle met with them and despite our requests for them not to promote another Pines garage sale they are doing it anyway.

Mall Maintenance: Fran Frataccia said she and Carol Magierski go up to the Mall weekly to pick weeds and cut bushes. She also said the palms look terrible and need to be trimmed.

Membership: Melissa Johnson reported as of 2/14/24: Membership dollars @ \$18,680, # of members @ 284, % of homes paid @ 31.5%. A letter & survey was mailed 2/2/24 to 658 nonpaid residents asking them to pay. Results are: 4 surveys with 34 payments @ \$2,320 a ROI of 329%. Peter reviewed progress on the electronic payment capture project to 1) Collect better data, 2) Sending auto confirmations, 3) Recovering processing fees. Motion: Shanon Larimer moved to change 2024 electronic membership fees once the new electronic payment system goes live to include the base processing fee of \$1.80. Electronic membership payments would now be Standard @ \$51.80, Bronze @ \$61.80, Silver @ \$81.80, Gold @ \$101.80, and Platinum @ \$251.80. Payment via check or cash would not change as previously approved without the processing fee. Fran Frataccia seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Needles: Peter Mason reported on behalf of Denise Ertler. The February/March Needles were printed in full color which looks great, 2024 Needles Sponsor Ads have been sent to Digital to post online.

New Neighbor Welcome: Peter Mason as the Acting New Neighbor Welcome Committee Chair reported that Tonio Bianca has joined and was given updated packets to deliver. Peter has reorganized the program materials, adding material he received from Orange County.

Yard of the Month: Shanon Larimer reviewed modernizing and streamlining the Yard of the Month rules for increased awareness, participation, and memberships. Motion: Fran Frataccia moved to change the rules for the WPPCA Yard of the Month Program as reflected in the document titled WPPCA YOM Proposed 2024 Changes, draft #6 updated January 30, 2024, as presented in the pre-reads. Melissa Johnson seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously with no abstentions.

Meeting called to order by WPPCA President, Peter Mason at 7:34 pm. A quorum was present.


