It signaled the end of World War I, known as Armistice Day, (a truce, signed between the Allies of World War I and Germany at Compiègne, France). In 1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower officially changed the name of the holiday from Armistice Day to Veterans Day. This day is set aside in commemoration of the end of hostilities in 1918 and 1945 and observed as a legal holiday in the U.S. to honor all veterans of the armed forces.

As we have done in the past, again this year, along with a "Thank You" letter from the WPPCA, the Pines community would like to recognize all our veterans who have served in the United States Armed Services by placing a flag in the yard of these veterans.

WPPCA – Monthly Board Meeting Minutes

August 10th, 2022 @ 7:30pm via zoom

Directors in attendance: Denise Ertler (2nd VP), Fran Frataccia, Brent Ludlow, Ben Taylor, Michelle Deleon, Amy Turner, Chris Hyma (Treasurer),

Directors absent: Peter Mason (President), WPPCA Members in attendance: Becky Clisch; WPPCA Non-members in attendance: None. Guest in attendance: None

Meeting was called to order by WPPCA 2nd Vice President, Denise Ertler at 7:34pm. A quorum was present. Denise greeted everyone.

<u>**President's Report:**</u> Denise provided an update of Peter's health. She thanked Becky Clisch for stepping in to take the minutes as acting Secretary.

Secretary: No report

Treasurer: Chris shared information about our bank accounts. Savings is at 39, 177.00. Checking has \$4406.00. The balance of \$25, 000 for the mall sign has to be paid and \$734.00 for insurance. Chris will be connecting with Amy for the funds from the garage sales. Ben motioned to accept the Treasure's Report. Fran seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

<u>Code Enforcement</u>: Fran reviewed code enforcement cases with the group. Cases included: 2 high grass and debris in yard, 1 high grass in yard, 1 debris in yard, 1 theft fraud counterfeit, 1 grand theft, 1 battery, 1 large shopping cart and venti Starbucks cup in the yard. Two residents inquired about the large Alan Grayson sign in the mall entrance. Carlton Arms did not ok the sign. Code enforcement called 311 a second time and spoke with Jackie. She said we could remove the sign.

Events: Amy reported that she was in contact with Paul, the new owner of the Winter Park Pines Golf Course. She will discuss with Paul the possibility of the golf course being a meeting place for National Night Out. Amy discussed the possibility of a group bike ride before the National Night Out. This bike ride could be in memory of Andy Engert.

Facebook: Ben mentioned not many people seem to post on our Facebook page.

<u>Mall Maintenance:</u> Fran contacted Progressive Insurance for payment. They still two invoices for the work completed. Ben mentioned he received a call about weeds in the median. He was asking Fran if the landscapers took care of the weeds. The sprinkler system needs to be checked.

Membership: Michelle reported there was an uptick in membership, and the signs appear to be working. Out of 901 homes there are 386 paid members. That is 42.8 % of the houses. Membership dues are \$23,925. Michelle believes there will be money left over for new two side membership signs.

Needles: Denise reported the Needles were inadvertently printed in color. Though they look great it is almost twice the money to print them in color. It is \$435.00 to print the Needles at this time. Denise stated that a WPHS journalism student is interested in doing a monthly article for the newsletter. These articles would be pertaining to students or alumni of Winter Park high School.

<u>New Neighbors:</u> Michelle was not able to welcome any neighbors.

NextDoor: Denise and Ben discussed the inability to post on NextDoor, to Pines specific neighbors.

Website: Kim has new updates she will post on the website.

Yard of the Month: Brent reported on all YOM winners. August 2022 1st Place- 402 Saint Dunstan Way - Philip Wallace. 2nd Place- 403 Friar Road - Zachary Gillett,

3rd Place 2918 Montfitchet Lane - Peter Vassos.

Old Business: Mall/Sign: Brent discussed the design stone concept. The plants chosen need to bring focus to the sign. Motion to give Brent the ok to do whatever he likes with the plants and hardscaping, as long as it does not exceed 2500.00. Ben motioned to pass the agreement and Amy seconded the motion.

<u>New Business:</u> The budget is voted on in September. The second Wednesday in October is for elections to the board. Chris is stepping off as treasurer. Ben asked for Onamexofneetiple in Stepten beninter 2020. tWsehope Peter will be back to lead the meeting.

Closing:

8:26: Ben motioned to adjourn; Brent seconded it. Motion passed with no abstentions.

September 14, 2022 @ 7:30pm via zoom

Meeting called to order by WPPCA 2nd Vice President, Denise Ertler at 7:31pm. A quorum was present.

<u>President's Report:</u> Denise provided an update on Peter's health.

Secretary: Nothing new to report.

Treasurer: Chris shared information on our bank accounts. July and August financials showed large expenses due in part to the new wall. The final insurance monies were deposited. Total for the wall was Creative Signs: \$33,349.17 and landscaping: \$1,619.12. The wall and landscaping are considered a fixed asset and the expense will be estimated over the life of the wall, which is about 10 years. Expenses were yard of the month payments, lawn maintenance, the Needles printing cost, and landscaping. The budget for 2023 shows increases in insurance, landscaping and printing cost. Peter to include \$700.00 to \$900.00 for bylaws. Ben Taylor motioned to accept the budget and Brent seconded. Motion passed. Denise stated the day worked at the election brought in \$640.
